The Potomac Highlands Guild provides a range of mental health and substance abuse services to individuals and families in their community. **These services may include:**

- **Counseling and therapy:** Individual, group, and family counseling sessions conducted by licensed therapists to address various mental health concerns such as depression, anxiety, trauma, and relationship issues.
- **Psychiatric services:** Assessment, diagnosis, and medication management for individuals with mental health disorders, provided by psychiatrists or psychiatric nurse practitioners.
- **Substance use disorders:** Programs and support services for individuals struggling with substance abuse and addiction, including outpatient counseling, intensive outpatient programs (IOPs), and referrals to detoxification and residential treatment facilities. Our services include Medical Management, Individual Therapy, Medication-Assisted Treatment for Substance use disorders, and Peer Recovery Services. We are here to support you in every step of your journey towards better mental health.

At Potomac Highlands Guild, we deeply understand and respect that each individual's needs are unique.

We encourage individuals seeking our services to reach out to one of our five locations. We will schedule a comprehensive Intake assessment tailored to identify your specific needs. Once these needs are identified, we will work closely with you to schedule appointments for the services that best meet your unique requirements.

Potomac Highlands Guild takes pride in its team of ten highly skilled behavioral health therapists. Our staff, which includes a licensed psychologist, licensed clinical independent social worker, licensed social workers, and master-prepared clinicians, is dedicated to providing the highest-quality care. Our services are available in five locations: Grant, Hardy, Hampshire, Mineral, and Pendleton counties. We offer therapy services that can be conducted in person or via telehealth, depending on your preference and needs.

PHG offers Medical Management for mental health-related medications and employs a board-certified psychiatrist and a physician's assistant trained in behavioral health. Both providers see clients in all five counties and prescribe Psychiatric and ADHD medication. Following their comprehensive intake assessment, the individual can be scheduled for an appointment.

PHG provides Medication-Assisted treatment for Substance use by a highly trained nurse Practitioner and Physician assistants. For individuals in need, a Vivitrol and Suboxone clinic is offered. The Vivitrol clinic is provided in all five counties, with Suboxone only provided in the Mineral Co office and The Russ Hedrick Center in Petersburg.

PHG is proud to provide Peer Recovery services to individuals with substance use disorders. Licensed and non-licensed providers provide Peer Recovery services in all five counties. Recovery coaches help individuals with substance use disorders by sharing their own personal lived experiences to help others navigate their recovery.

INPATIENT

Medication-Assisted Treatment

Suboxone (Buprenorphine)

Suboxone is an opiate agonist and antagonist, meaning it has an opiate (buprenorphine) and also a blocker (naloxone) which attaches to the mu receptors of the brain and decreases cravings for opiates.

Methadone

Methadone, a long-acting opioid agonist, reduces opioid craving and withdrawal and blunts or blocks the effects of opioids. Taken daily, it is available in liquid, powder and diskette forms. Patients taking methadone to treat Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) must receive the medication under the supervision of a practitioner.
